

Possible CFS decisions on FPV
(not in order of priority)

1. CFS (or FAO?) will advise countries on the options for reducing dependency on food imports (for example FAO prepares case studies and best practices, eventually maybe an international conference).
2. CFS decides to include a section on agroecology and strengthening local, national and regional markets in the GSF.
3. CFS requests donors and intergovernmental agencies to prioritise support for agroecological models in field work.
4. CFS requests research institutions to prioritise research into agroecological models, using participatory methodologies that recognise a plurality of knowledge systems, including indigenous knowledge, and to adopt internal governance rules that help to hold them more accountable to the small food producers they serve.
5. Requests governments, particularly of the G20, to adopt a precautionary approach to the role of financial speculation in food price volatility by enforcing tighter regulation of commodity markets, thereby contributing towards fulfilling their extra-territorial obligations on the right to food.
6. CFS decides to explore options for creating a more effective multi-lateral governance of agricultural trade.
7. CFS supports the establishment of food reserves at global, regional, national and local levels and will explore options for an appropriate governance system for the reserves.
8. The CFS will monitor commitments and impacts of investments in agriculture.
